How to find us - Farnham

From M1 South and Southbound M3:

From the Southbound M1 take the Slip road onto the M25 heading towards Heathrow Airport. Take the exit onto the Southbound M3 (signposted Basingstoke). Follow the M3 to Junction 4. Leave the M3 following signs for Farnborough, Farnham, Camberly etc A331. The slip road takes you a roundabout where you take the second exit (signposted Guildford, Farnham, Aldershot, Birdworld A331). Carry on along the A331 to a roundabout where you take the second exit onto the A31 (signposted Winchester, Farnham A31). # At the large 'SHEPHERD AND FLOCK' roundabout take the third exit onto the A325 (signposted Odiham and then Badshot Lee) N.B. DO NOT TAKE THE SECOND EXIT A325 TO CENTRAL FARNHAM. Almost immediately there is a small roundabout, take the FIRST EXIT, continuing on the A325. # The next roundabout is the SIX BELLS roundabout. Take the first exit (signposted Central Farnham B3007). Pass the Six Bells public house on the right hand side, and Vets Now is on the right immediately before the zebra crossing, opposite Farnham Hospital (Hale Road).

From Guildford:

Take the A31 West towards Winchester and Farnham. Continue on the A31 until you reach the large 'SHEPHERD AND FLOCK' roundabout. # Then as above.

From Alton:

Take the A31 North / East towards Farnham and Guildford. At the Cox-bridge roundabout (junction with the A325)

carry straight on on the A31 Farnham bypass. Carry on through a set of traffic lights to the 'SHEPHERD AND FLOCK' roundabout on the edge of Farnham. !!! At the 'SHEPHERD AND FLOCK' take the second exit onto the A325 (signposted Odiham and then Badshot Lee) N.B. DO NOT TAKE THE FIRST EXIT A325 TO CENTRAL FARNHAM. Almost immediately there is a small roundabout, take the FIRST EXIT continuing on the A325. The next roundabout is the SIX BELLS roundabout. Take the first exit (signposted Central Farnham B3007). Pass the Six Bells public house on the right hand side, and Vets Now is on the right immediately before the zebra crossing, opposite Farnham Hospital (Hale Road).

From A287 (South), Hindhead, Frensham, Churt, Haslemere:

Take the A287 north towards Farnham. At the junction with the A31, turn right onto the A31 Farnham Bypass. Carry on along the A31 until you reach the large 'SHEPHERD AND FLOCK' roundabout. !!! Then as above.

From A325 (South), Wrecklesham Rowledge (Liphook via B3004)

Take the A325 north towards Farnham. At the Cox-bridge roundabout turn right onto the A31 Farnham Bypass. Carry on, through a set of traffic lights until you reach the large 'SHEPHERD AND FLOCK' roundabout. !!! Then as above.

From the M3 (Jct 5), A287 (north), Odiham, North Warnborough, Crondall:

Take the A287 southeast towards Farnham (heading southwards from the M3). \$ The A287 enters Hale and becomes the A3016 Upper hale Road. Carry straight on through a set of traffic lights (Junction with A325) down Hale Road until you reach the 'SIX BELLS' roundabout. Take the third exit (signposted Central Farnham B3007). Pass the Six Bells public house on the right hand side, and Vets Now is on the right immediately before the zebra crossing, opposite Farnham Hospital (Hale Road).

From Fleet:

Take the B3013 Beaconhill Road south. At the road junction with the A287 turn left towards Farnham on the Odiham Road. \$ Then as above.

From Aldershot:

Take the A325 south towards Farnham. Follow the A325 through a set of traffic lights (bearing slightly left into Hale Road) until you reach the 'SIX BELLS' roundabout. Take the third exit (signposted Central Farnham B3007). Pass the Six Bells public house on the right hand side, and Vets Now is on the right immediately before the zebra crossing, opposite Farnham Hospital (Hale Road).
